
My graduate camp

After this camp, I learned many things about my group members, and this is the happiest time in my primary school life ever.





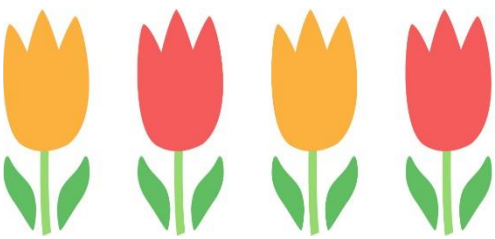




My graduate camp







needed to turn a circle with the board, as the girls and boys had a good tacit agreement, we easily got to the end, but because the boys didn't practice, they didn't know what to do.


